Jer 1:4-5, 17-19 – Before I formed you in your mother's womb, I knew you.
 1Cor 12:31-13:13 – If I don't have love, I have nothing.
 Lk 4:21-30 – Isn't this the Son of Joseph the Carpenter?

This reading is so very true. The reaction to the folks at home to ones good fortune and achievements are certainly mixed. There are those who are "happy" for a son, nephew, neighbor that has made it good. In fact, many share in the good fortune with a pride that someone from the community has done well. However, there are others who become envious of another's success. The reaction is far from amicable and well-intentioned; they become critical of the person. They dig up the dirt (so to speak) about the individual or his or her family. They try to use it to make the person small and less important, instead of lifting him – his virtues and accomplishments up. This was the very thing which happened to Jesus on that visit home. Do those fancy things here in Nazareth as we heard were done in Capernaum.

Capernaum was a larger more affluent community in the deep northern territory. It was a community that had a heavy Gentile presence. Many of those Jesus encountered were Gentiles. In traditional circles, this would not have

been something that was praiseworthy. Jews for the most part looked down on non-Jewish people. The Jews were the chosen people and the rest did not matter. Jesus did not obviously show this attitude and this bothered some of them.

Jeremiah (1:4-5, 17-19) is our first reading. He is called the reluctant Prophet. One can see clearly why he and others did not overwhelmingly accept this calling. They knew that a Prophet is not always accepted by the people. Especially if he goes or speaks against the run of the mill thought or held opinion. When he tries to change the thoughts and opinion the group has had for generations, there's problems. This is certainly true concerning the attitude of Gentile and Jewish relationships. In fact, there is still in our time the same bad feeling and tension.

When Jesus read the scroll, that strange afternoon, He left out from the reading of Isaiah the overturning of the Gentiles and the ultimate collapse of their people. And it will be the Jews who will be victorious now. All the wealth and power the sons of Abraham will yield. Instead, Jesus leaves this out and speaks of the Gentile woman from Sarephath, who was the exemplary of charity and hospitality. So much so, that Elijah, through God, blessed and sheltered them. Then too, the Gentile Naaman, the Syrian. Jesus says "No one in all of Israel showed as much faith as he." This example sent them over to the point of trying to kill him.

The same holds true about the change set by Jesus today; His own would not accept the challenge then, as well as our own age. I guess it hasn't changed of 2000+ years. When the Pope or some other prophet tries to change our opinions or challenge ancient beliefs, there are many that react the same. Some will go to extreme actions, than be challenged to alter their opinion. We see this in a variety of examples. The thoughts on abortion are not widely agreed on in our Church let alone the whole Christian Community. Don't even bring up the notion of birth control! Other issues – same sex marriages, family, racism, stem cell research, execution of convicts, euthanasia, guns, immigration etc. have divided not only a culture and nation, but the Church as well. Top it off you put a dash of envy to the mix. Envy is a deadly sin, and with it dissention it becomes an explosive situation.

Prophets will always be few in number, and their situation uncertain. But they are need, is great. Yes, they will always be a target for those who will not listen to the Lord. God is still calling for a living and working together of all people today as He did 2000 years ago. The Gentiles of our day have their place in God's design, and He will not have them not participate in His master plan.

This week we pray for an end of bigotry, starting with ourselves and the only green eyed monster that we face is in a pickle jar or pea soup, and never in a mirror. Then green is truly clean. ~Fr. Joe
