Mission Statement

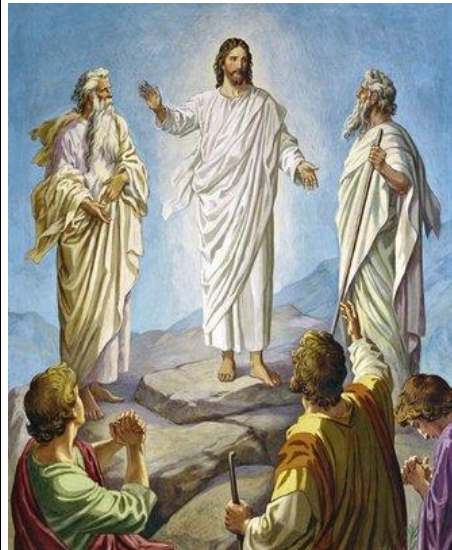

Gn 22:1-2, 9a, 10-13, 15-18/Rom 8:31b-34/Mk 9:2-10



Today's readings really fit in to what we've been talking about this Lent. One of my favorite stories of the Gospels, the scene of the Transfiguration. It is a story that yearly finds itself in the Sunday Lenten readings. As we are familiar with it, Jesus goes up on a mountain top to pray. He takes with Him, Peter, James and John. And while the Lord prays, the three apostles see the great Old Testament figures with Him, Moses (giver of the law) and Elijah (protector of the law). It is not as dramatic as the other Gospel presentations. It's

short and concise. In their astonishment, the apostles wish to make 3 shelters for them. To which, before they realize, the two patriarchs are gone, leaving Jesus all alone. However, those words from the shy were engraved on their hearts, "This is my begotten Son. Listen to Him."

There are a number of themes running through this story. Firstly, there is the mountain theme. Many divine manifestations occurred on mountains. Abraham in the first reading is tested but confirmed in faith and commitment on the mountain – Moriah. Moses, one that appears on the mountain with Jesus received the law from Mt. Sinai. While centuries later, Isaiah will prophesize that again the Temple Mount would be restored and so with it the Davidic line. Emmanuel will come, and it would be in the form of Jesus. Mt. Tabor, the place of the Transfiguration, would be the place where Jesus will show Himself to His disciples, as the fulfillment and long-awaited Messiah, who would change the world.

Why was the mountain such a favorite place to initiate change? For it is on the mountain that one is able to from its height look down and clearly see the situation down below. There are not too many distractions here, as well. Then, too, one is closer to God, so to speak up high. The ancients always viewed God (as well the pagans and their god's) living in the heights.

Next, from the mountain tops came divine revelations. When Abraham came down, we see a new covenant made. Abraham, like God the Father, wants to liberate his people from sin, even to giving up his son in sacrifice. Yahweh will go the full extent of sacrifice by giving Jesus up on Mt. Calvary. There His life would atone for sin of mankind once and for all. On Mt. Tabor, Jesus would know where His pilgrimage would lead. What great love He was to demonstrate. If only we can...Listen to Him!

From Mt. Tabor, He is the beloved Son. It is also from Mt. Tabor, we are also the beloved sons and daughters, if we listen to Him.

As Samuel said centuries before, "Speak Lord, your servant listens". When we listen, we make that turn – we change. ~Fr. Joe

Here are some **important dates** to make note of for the **Confirmation Candidates:**

1. Saint reports are due by **March 18, 2018**, and **MUST** be turned into the CCD office. The candidate should explain who the Saint is that they chose, and why they chose that Saint.
2. The record of service hours is due **NO LATER THAN APRIL 8, 2018**, and **MUST** be turned in by that date. Each candidate **MUST** have a minimum of 24 hours of community service for Confirmation. This has been requested over a 2-year period. The record sheets for service hours were included in your Pre-Confirmation packets that were handed out at the parent meeting in the fall of 2016, and again in the fall of 2017. Please contact myself or your teacher if you have any questions regarding this. This is a requirement and has been mentioned several times.
3. Fr. Joe will be conducting interviews with the candidates this semester. A date has not yet been selected.
4. The Mass has been selected by the Diocese, and we were given the date of May 4 with Bishop Zubik.
