My old pastor use to say “Make the best of each and every day. For each one is an opportunity.” Everyone has problems. To curl up in your room and let the world go by us is not a solution. Time is a very important commodity. When we get older and see how time passes by so quickly, it is apparent that we should as they say “make hay when the sun shines.” As we look at the scriptures they are all stories of people who, when given the opportunity, made the attempt to utilize the time and the moment.

Moses was running away from his problem. He was a fugitive from Pharaoh's Court. Found as a baby on the Nile River bank by an Egyptian princess, he was raised in the King's court. All was well until he discovered he was a Jew. After killing an Egyptian for abusing a Hebrew, he now was a wanted man. In his self exile the Lord drew him to the holy mountain, to which asked him to lead the people to freedom, and the land of milk and honey. Moses, here, seizes the moment. In our second reading, St. Paul addresses the Corinthians not to seek after evil things. Also, he tells them not to grumble as the Jews did against God

and Moses in the desert. Take advantage of God's grace and not fall apart. Seize the moment, and become.

In the Gospel this Sunday, Jesus addresses some of the peoples concern about bad things happening to the community. This bringing up the age old question, "Why does bad things happen to good people?" In life, as they say, "a little rain must fall." It's not always rosy or positive. Never was it meant to be so. This is not our ultimate goal. We are being put to the test, and therefore to make the best of our situation here on earth. When the situation lends itself, we should make the best of the time or occasion. When facing adversity, we must try to weather the situation and trust in the Lord and our God given wits. With faith and loving support, we can overcome any problem.

God's people must face life head on. Always people that are hopeful, ready to seize the moment. All the while, knowing that with God on our side, we will never falter. Cape Diem. ~Fr. Joe
