I like the sport of angling (fishing), but never got an award for catching the most fish. Many times, I catch nothing. My fish dinner came from Long John Silver's. Nonetheless, it is a good sport that forces you outdoors and truly challenges your patience (of which I have none). Like many of you my faithful brothers and sisters, I really have to work at it.

Although the Baba's could tell you, I've come a long way, especially in the time that I've spent here with you.

As difficult for me (and I'm sure for most) to catch a nice quota of fish, is my fishing for men (and also women). The Lord was not, non-challenging nor easy on the apostles or the apostles of our age, when He commissioned us to "catch souls" for Him. Like so many things, we fall short of divine expectations and then suffer from guilt and unworthiness. This was the case in this Sunday's reading with all the main figures. Isaiah admits his folly, as he refers to himself as a man with unclean lips. St. Paul refers in today's reading as the "least of the apostle," a "persecutor" and murderer." Then good old St. Pete after a great catch of fish and the awesome feeling he received standing before Jesus, exclaims "depart from me, for I am a sinful man." We, too, feel like that in those moments of truth at times when we experience them. When all dilution and false/blotted pride is removed, then we can see ourselves as we truly are.

None of us can, in all honesty stand before Him unblemished and not in need of help. It reminds me of an old afro-American hymn, we were taught in grade school. The words are "It's me – It's me, Oh Lord, standing in the need of prayer." How true this is! However with His loving presence and grace, we can, like Isaiah, Paul & St. Peter, with Him sanctified and made holy. Our sins are covered up. We are made whole. Without God, we are paralyzed. With Him, we no longer have to fear. We are one with Him, and this makes us invincible.

A good set of readings this Quadragesima Sunday (Latin for 40 days before Easter). As we used this Sunday as a preparation for this sacred season, may we be reassured of His goodness and mercy. May we never allow ourselves to be paralyzed by our sin and unworthiness.

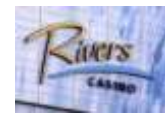

**Our 2015 Campaign for Parish Share begins this weekend, Feb. 14<sup>th</sup> & 15<sup>th</sup> at all Masses.** The parish Share Appeal is the diocesan program that solicits financial support for all of its parishes. The Parish Share assessment is based on the operating income of each individual parish. The assessment amount is 17% of Sunday offerings and fund raising profits. Parish share monies are used to support the administrative work of the diocese, for ongoing education of employees and for the formation of diocesan Seminarians, among other needs. As parishioners, we are encouraged to support the greater effort of our diocese. Please remember that any money collected above the amount of our assessment is kept by the parish and not taxable by the diocese. Parishioners are reminded that we rely on excess Parish Share to balance our yearly budget. All registered parishioners of St. Christopher received a Parish Share letter in the mail stating that our assessment this year \$53,085 (including the Catholic School Subsidy). Just like last year, before the homily, we will pass out the campaign envelopes. We will give you time to fill them out at Mass. Thank you for your support.

**Lenten Regulations:** The church has established the following to remind us that the practice of penance is a necessary part of Easter preparation.

- Ash Wednesday (Feb 13) and Good Friday (March 29) are days of fast and abstinence. The Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence in the U.S.).
- The obligation of abstinence (refraining from eating meat) begins at the age of 14. The law of fasting (limiting oneself to one full meal and two lighter meals) obliges all between the ages of 18 and 59. No one should consider this obligation lightly.
- Those who have a medical condition in which fasting may be considered harmful are not obliged to fast, but they should perform some other act of penance or charity.
- Pastors and parents are to see to it that minors, though not bound by the law of fast and abstinence, are educated in the authentic sense of penance and encouraged to do acts of penance suitable to their age.
- As a general rule, a request for a dispensation from the obligation of abstinence on Fridays of Lent will not be considered unless some serious reason is present. Attendance at social events, banquets, wedding rehearsals or receptions, or funeral wakes are not.

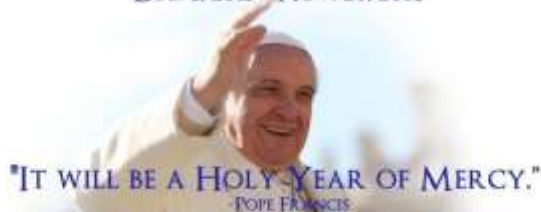
